Pink Lake Tiny House wins Resorts & Retreats Award 2023

[The Pink Lake Tiny House](#) in South Australia's Clare Valley is delighted to announce it has been awarded "Best eco-friendly accommodation - South Australia" in the Resorts and Retreats awards by LUXLife Magazine based in the United Kingdom.

Sustainability is central to our philosophy. Electricity for the tiny houses is generated through solar panels on the roof and stored in a battery for use overnight. Our rain water is collected on the roof and stored in a 5,000-litre tank. Both mains water and power are also connected as back-up to ensure guests are not inconvenienced. The toilets are odourless bio-composting toilets and the grey water from the sink and shower is filtered to water the plant bed. All recycling is collected and goes back to Adelaide.

The original tiny house called 'Sakura' is beautifully themed with Japanese décor and has a well-equipped kitchen and living area, and a bathroom with toilet, shower, and wash basin. It has two loft bedrooms with quality Japanese futons, one with a skylight for stargazing and games and karaoke.

The largest tiny house called 'Peony', has a modern Asian décor and is equipped with a Queen bed downstairs and second loft-style bedroom with two Japanese futons. Peony also has a projector for watching movies and blue-tooth microphones for singing karaoke.

The accommodation is designed so that guests can connect with the people they are travelling with. Quality fittings and luxury shower gels complement the attention evident in the quality fit-out.

Both houses cater for up to four guests and have patio decks which overlook the pink lake so that guests can enjoy the amazing views of the pink lake with its constantly changing colours.

Owner operators, Michael and Christina Seeliger say that the lake is a major drawcard for day-trippers from Adelaide, however by not staying overnight, visitors miss seeing stunning sunset and sunrise views of the lake.

"That's where the idea for the Pink Lake Tiny House originated – to create a place where people could stay and enjoy the magic moments at the lake in the morning and evening, when the range and intensity of the colours leave a lasting impact."

For a unique Australian experience, the VIP Korean-style BBQ Overnight Dinner Package comes highly recommended with a five-star rating on Google reviews. The package includes a special welcome drink, a campfire with billy tea and roasted marshmallows and star-talk hosted by the one and only celebrity "Mike Bean".

"Our newly established glamping tents, where guests can simply drive up and it is all there, offer another wonderful accommodation option to the tiny houses."
